Background

Thank you for your interest in working with the Shoosmiths Foundation.

The Shoosmiths Foundation is a grant making body launched in June 2021 working to help address societal issues, to empower sustainable change, and to improve the lives of the people and the environment in the UK.

The Foundation builds on Shoosmiths' long-standing community investment programme which continues to support local charity partners through staff fundraising and firm donations, staff volunteering and provision of legal advice pro bono legal advice.

The Shoosmiths Foundation offers grants in the following categories to:

- advance social mobility in the legal sector, and across the UK, in line with the Shoosmiths social mobility action plan.
 Particular focus on charitable organisations which share our belief that 'talent can come from anywhere', and which align their interventions with local socio-economic analysis and need:
- · advance a carbon net zero UK; and
- · advance access to justice in the UK.

Eligibility for Grants

Grants are available for UK registered charities undertaking work in the UK.

This application round will advance access to justice within the UK with funding of between £25k and £50k provided to the successful charity applicant. Eligible applications will progress either of the following:

- sustaining or improving community access to specialist legal advice
- leveraging organisation's and/or educational institutions pro bono programmes to increase access to justice.

Applications must:

- be able to report measurable improvements in access to justice, including the social impact of the actions taken through the delivery of the project.
- be local to one or more <u>Shoosmiths UK location/s</u> and within the location/s relate to areas with lower social mobility prospects. Some examples include <u>the English indices of deprivation</u>, <u>the long shadow of deprivation</u>, <u>BITC's state of the nation 2021: social mobility and the pandemic and Scottish index of multiple deprivation</u>.
- projects must address underrepresentation and support intersectionality more broadly. For example, these would be projects that not only support access to justice prospects but also address other factor(s) of underrepresentation such as*:
 - Characteristics listed in the Equality Act 2010
 - Ex-military personnel
 - People with convictions
 - People experiencing homelessness
 - Long-term unemployed
 - Refugees
 - Care-experienced individuals

*Please note this list is not exhaustive.

- We welcome applications from UK registered small charities (with an annual income less than £1 million).
- Out of scope projects that will not be considered:
 - projects that are more generically access to justice focused,
 This funding round aims to address systemic and
 structural issues regarding access to justice, projects that
 seek to fund specific legal cases will not be considered.
 - projects that do not impact communities in Shoosmiths' UK locations
 - projects that cannot measure the social impact that Shoosmiths funding would achieve if part of a larger funded project.

Funding is at the discretion of the Shoosmiths Foundation Grants Committee.

Restrictions

Please refer to the Shoosmiths Community Investment Policy for exclusions. See **here**.

Funding is not available for individuals.

Applications are restricted to one application per charity.

Applications must relate to a specific project.

Applications are not permitted for the direct funding of legal cases.

Applications are not permitted for unrestricted funding requests.

Application procedure

Only fully completed applications submitted via the online Shoosmiths Foundation application form will be considered. The questions in the application form allow the Shoosmiths Foundation Grants Committee to decide which projects to fund so please complete the form fully but succinctly within the word limits provided. The maximum character limit is stipulated for each question, and as long as you clearly answer each question you would not be expected to use the maximum character count.

The closing date for applications is **4pm Friday 18th April 2024** OR sooner once we have received sufficient suitable applications. Early applications are therefore encouraged.




